Speaker Howell Announces Delegate, Citizen Appointments to State Boards, Joint Committees and Commissions

RICHMOND, VA – Speaker of the Virginia House of Delegates William J. Howell (R-Stafford) today announced his decisions on the 2010 appointments of delegates and citizens to over 100 state boards, commissions and joint House-Senate committees. As presiding officer of the [100-member House of Delegates](#), Speaker Howell performs many duties, including assigning all bills to House committees; appointing the chairmen and members of each of the 14 standing committees of the House; naming delegates to all House-Senate conference committees, including the one for the biennial state budget; and appointing House lawmakers and citizens to statewide panels before the start of the new state fiscal year on July 1.

“Virginia long has been blessed by so many talented, experienced and engaged citizens who are willing to volunteer and actively participate in the hard work of self-government,” said Speaker Howell. “These distinguished men and women leaders will serve their communities and our Commonwealth well for they reflect the diversity of character and the depth and breadth of problem-solving skills of all Virginians.
